



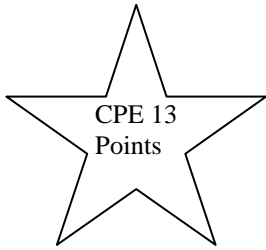

This workshop is aimed at those who would like more depth in understanding family violence, practical strategies, and specific skills in working directly with perpetrators using violence, abuse and coercive control against family members. Of significance is the central aspect of maintaining a program, policy and practitioner focus on the safety and wellbeing of women and children and other family members directly affected by the dynamic of family and domestic violence.

The workshop will be presented by **Tori Cooke** who is well known as a leader in the field of family violence. Tori has worked in women's refuges, courts, child protection, men's behaviour change and policy contexts for over 16 years. Presently, Tori is the Manager, Justice and Family Services for Ruah Community Services managing women's services and through consultancy provides advice, program development and training in this complex and challenging work.

By the end of this workshop, participants will develop:

- A high level understanding of family and domestic violence and the associated safety and risk considerations when working with perpetrators;
- A strong appreciation of the attitudes, behaviours and beliefs that underpin violence against women and children and other family members; and,
- A range of tools that enable community and clinical practitioners to have confidence in their work with men using violence, abuse and coercive control in their families and communities.
